Community: Southside is located five miles south of historic Batesville, Arkansas, a city of 10,300. Spanning 52 miles, Southside School District serves the educational needs of the rapidly growing area south of Batesville. Currently, the district utilizes a PreK, K-3, 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12 grade-level configuration on five campuses.

School: Southside High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 400 students in grades 10 through 12. The senior class of 2016 has a student population of 121. Designated as a Title 1 school, approximately 55% of the students receive free or reduced lunch. 100% of the teaching staff is highly qualified in their area of expertise with many holding higher degrees. All classrooms are equipped with high definition display technology.

Calendar: The school calendar consists of 178 days, divided into two 18 week semesters with a daily schedule of seven 50 minute periods.

Rank and GPA Calculation: Rank in class and grade point average is computed using the scale below. All students with the same GPA will have the same class rank. Beginning with grade 9, all high school courses, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. Seven credits per year is the maximum course load. A minimum of 23 credits is required for graduation. AP courses are weighted by one point. Grades are recorded on the transcript and rank and GPA are computed in January and May.
